

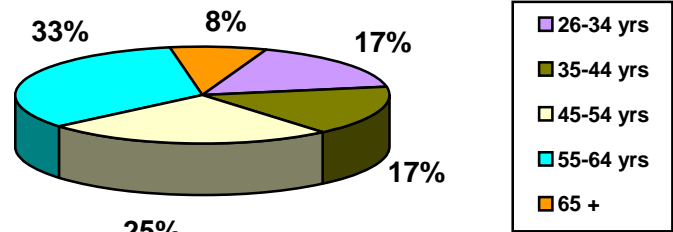
**Nevada

➤ The majority of social work respondents in Nevada are 45 years or older (66%).

Age

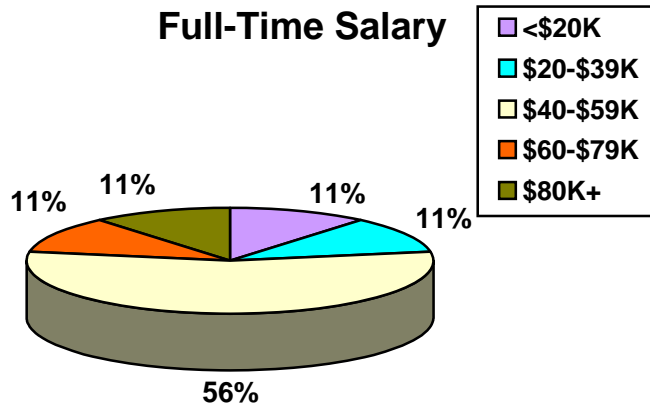
➤ The majority of social workers in Nevada are white (75%).

➤ Equal numbers of Nevada social work respondents hold bachelor's and master's degrees as their highest social work degree (45%). Nine percent hold a doctorate.



➤ Respondents were asked to identify their primary practice setting for employment. The three most frequently cited categories were schools (17%), private solo practice (17%) and social service agencies (17%).

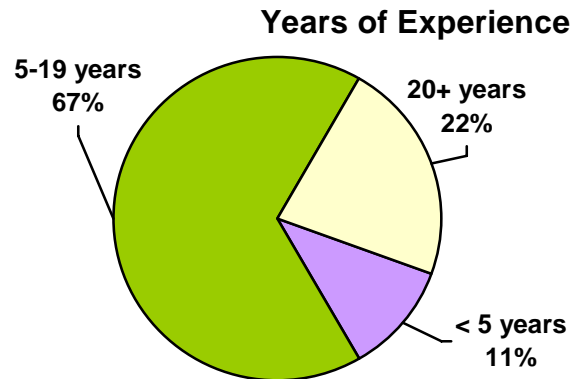
Full-Time Salary



➤ The majority of Nevada's respondents (56%) earn between \$40,000 and \$59,000 annually for full-time social work.

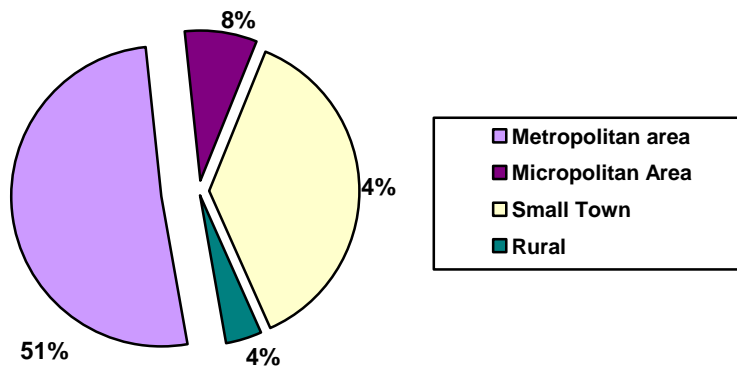
¹ This information is based on the results of the 2004 NASW National Survey of Licensed Social Workers. The total number of responses received was 4,487. Twelve (12) respondents were from the state of Nevada.

- The majority of social work respondents in Nevada have five to 19 years of experience (67%). Eleven percent of them are new to the field, with less than five years of experience.



- The majority of Nevada's respondents are employed in a private, non-profit setting (31%). The rest of the social workers are employed evenly in private, for-profit settings, and local and state governments (23% each).

Location of Primary Work Setting



- The majority of social workers in Nevada are employed in a metropolitan area (91%).
- The most frequently cited categories for primary practice areas were Mental Health (25%) and Health (25%).
